## **DOCTRINAL STATEMENT**

- 1. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, verbally inspired by God the Holy Spirit (II Sam. 23:2; II Peter 1:21), inerrant in the original writings (Matt. 5:18; Luke 24:44), and the supreme and final authority in faith and practice (II Tim. 3:16, 17; John 12:48).
- 2. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, coequal in power and glory, and having the same attributes and perfections (II Cor. 13:14; John 10:30; Gal. 4:6; Matt. 3:16, 17).
- 3. We believe that all men are sinners (Rom. 3:12, 23), and apart from Christ they are presently and eternally dead in their sins (Eph. 2:1), are separated from God (Eph. 2:12), and are under His condemnation (John 3:18, 36).
- 4. We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit (Matt. 1:20; Luke 1:35), was born of the Virgin Mary (Isa. 7:14; Luke 2:7), lived entirely without sin (Heb. 4:1-5; 7:26), died as the sinner's substitute, making perfect atonement for the sins of the world (II Cor. 5:21; I Peter 3:18; Heb. 10:10-14; I John 2:2), was raised bodily from the dead (Luke 24:6, 39; I Cor. 15:1-4), and ascended to the right hand of the Father in heaven (Acts 1:9; 7:55, 56) where He is the believer's High Priest and advocate (Heb. 9:24; 7:25; I John 2:1).
- 5. We believe that all who receive by faith the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Savior are justified on the ground of His shed blood (Rom. 3:24; 25:5:9), are born again by the Holy Spirit through the Word (John 3:3-7; I Peter 1:23), thereby becoming children of God (John 1:12, 13; Gal. 3:26), and are indwelt and sealed by the Spirit until the day of redemption (Gal. 4:6; Eph. 1:13, 14). Believers are thus eternally united to Christ by the Spirit (I Cor. 12:12, 13) and together form the *true church*, the body and bride of Christ (Eph. 1:22, 23; 5:25-32; Rev. 19:7-9).
- 6. We believe that God, in His own time and way, will bring all of creation to an appropriate end. The dead will be raised and Christ will judge all men in righteousness (Acts 17:31; Romans 14:10; Revelation 20:15), and the righteous will receive their reward and dwell forever in the presence of the Lord (John 14:1-3, Romans 6:23; Revelation 21: 3-4).
